Our Wrest Point venue has PLENTY of seating for friends and family wishing to watch us in action. Because of this capacity, we are offering free entry to children under 13, accompanied by a paying adult.

Tickets purchased through Trybooking will not provide allocated seating with a chorus; that can only be done through the full Convention registration process. Session ticket seating is available in the unallocated areas in the Plenary Hall section in the rear of the auditorium.

Route for in-house choruses to start of Traffic Pattern


Choruses staying in-house at Wrest Point are requested NOT to cross the Traffic Pattern route in the Exhibition Foyer. Instead, please follow either of the marked routes on the following map to the Boardwalk Gallery entrance.

Route marked in Red

- Walk towards the convention centre
- Walk through Green Room Bar to the stairs (or take lift to go downstairs) to the Boardwalk Cafe and Bistro
- Exit outside onto the Boardwalk
- Turn left and walk around the outside of the building to the Boardwalk Gallery entrance

Route marked in Blue

- Exit main entrance near reception
- Take the stairs on the right-hand side of turning circle down to ground level
- Walk through the zone between the car park and the building
- Go past an entrance to the building and walk to the end of the building
- Go past the Wellington entrance
- Turn to the right and to access the Boardwalk Gallery entrance

Parade of Champions Briefing

If your chorus or quartet is eligible to perform in the Parade of Champions, a representative from each quartet and the chorus director must attend the briefing, which will be held at the conclusion of the Chorus Competition in the Tasman Room/Plenary Hall auditorium.

* If the Division A and Division AA Chorus Winners place in the top five, they will sing in the slot determined by their top five placements.

Brava Award

Each year at Regional Convention, a Brava Award is presented in both the chorus and quartet contests—provided there are competitors in the Open Division. If there's only one competitor, they receive the award in recognition of their work. When there are multiple competitors, audience members vote for the most entertaining package.

We're thrilled to have three choruses competing in this year's Open Division! To celebrate, we've had special new medals made for the Brava Award winners. Audience members viewing ALL Open Division competitors are eligible to vote for their favourite performance. To cast your vote, simply scan the Brava Award QR code, which can be found at key locations throughout the auditorium.

City to Casino Fun Run - Impacts Sunday 18 May

Wrest Point has informed us that the City to Casino Fun Run will take place on the morning of Sunday, 18 May 2025, between 7:50 AM and 10:00 AM, in the area surrounding Wrest Point.

During this time, road closures and traffic delays are expected. While guests will be able to exit the hotel, please be aware that delays are likely and alternative routes may be in effect. It is recommended to allow extra time for any travel plans on Sunday morning.

Departing Wrest Point

Guests can leave the hotel during the event. Drysdale Avenue (left lane) and Sandy Bay Road (northbound) will remain open. If travelling to the airport, please allow additional time as road closures through the city may impact travel times.

If you need a taxi during this period, the Sandy Bay Road pickup point, located just a 60-second walk from the hotel entrance, is recommended.

Arriving at Wrest Point

Please note that vehicle access to Wrest Point will not be possible between 7:50 AM and 10:00 AM. The Boardwalk Bistro and Boardwalk Café are open from 6.30am, so if you are attending an event in the morning, we highly recommend you arrive early and enjoy your morning coffee with us.

Cloakroom

We have reserved the Portlight Bar room as a cloakroom for Saturday 17 May. This may be used by delegates, at their own risk, for storage of bags, changes of clothes, etc. Please don't leave valuables in this room.

Security for the Portlight Bar room (cloakroom) will be provided from 10.00am to 9.30pm. All belongings must be removed from the room by 9.30pm.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of a fire alarm/emergency, please remain in the room unless otherwise instructed to evacuate. If you are instructed to evacuate by allocated Wrest Point staff, please calmly make your way to the nearest safe exit and proceed to follow the staff to the lower-level car park.

All Wrest Point Security staff are trained in first aid and our Event Supervisor will contact security for any medical emergencies.

Guest Artist



Our Opening Ceremony guest artist is **Vocalis**. Vocalis is a youth a cappella ensemble based in nipaluna/Hobart. Vocalis was formed in 2024 and has quickly grown from 8 members to over 20.

In 2024, Vocalis competed in their first ever barbershop contest and in a showcase concert with award-winning quartet Mixed Signals, along with other Hobart-based choruses and quartets. In 2025, Vocalis has many workshops and performances lined up, including the BHA Tas Regional contest and Festival of Voices.

Vocalis as a club is affiliated with both BHA and the Tasmanian University Student Association, and welcomes members aged 16-25 to sing, learn and perform together in a safe and inclusive environment. Vocalis was founded and is directed by Aaron Powell.

More on the Judges' Education Sessions

Valerie Taylor - The 3 Layered Cake of Resonance

Different vowels have a different natural resonant space. Explore tips and tricks to achieve unity across your quartet or chorus – whatever the word, pitch or volume level.

Valerie Taylor - Analytical Listening: where do I start!

This class will consider how we approach analytical listening, to help identify skill gaps and priorities in our chorus or quartet. Using audio examples, we will explore the hierarchy of vocal and artistic skills and discuss possible solutions.

Kerri Mauney - The Grammar of Singing

We'll discuss such things as parts of speech, punctuation, inflections, and literary devices, and how their functions play into story development and delivery.

Tori Postma - Create a Magical Performance or What you see is What you get.

True Audience Communication involves the VISUAL performance! To capture and hold an audience, the singers must visually, and vocally express the emotion and message of the song. What makes for a magical performance? How to tap into your CHARISMA....and learn to

SHARE it. What creates a standing ovation? Learn the elements the great professional performers use.
