I also work within Aged Care, bringing interactive engagement, music, humour and movement to elders and people living with dementia. I serve the QSE Diversity & Inclusion Group, the Shakespeare Theatre Association's IDEAA committee, and I am an Audio Describer of Live Theatre for Vision Australia.

My training and work experience makes me a highly collaborative, organised and playful creative — I have witnessed time and time again the benefits of theatre and music and am extremely passionate about sharing the skills and the fun

What can I bring to your chorus, quartet and singers?

Drawing on elements of actor training, including voice and movement, embodying text, theatre of the oppressed and improvisation, I bring an integrated approach to singing that allows the performer to shine, by understanding and connecting to the story and character, finding clarity of thought, strength and freedom in movement, and building relationship with ensemble and audience - all of which strengthen vocal production and choral unity.

I use a mix of games and exercises to warm participants into the theatrical experience and to build a comfortable, supportive sense of ensemble. Employing techniques from the Linklater Voice progression, I work to remove tension and free the singer's natural voice, allowing for deeper authentic expression and expanding the groups vocal potential.

This foundational work benefits all performers, from large choruses to new quartets and everyone in between, and as an integrated approach it supports the work of the director, music and visual teams.

My workshops are tailored to suit, considering the participants' needs and any possible challenges or concerns.
